Persevere with HOPE and JOY

God has done and is doing great things through the Renewal in the Church and the world, so our first response should always be gratitude: Give glory, praise and thanks to God!

My sense of how the Spirit is moving us today is twofold. First, we need to persevere in doing all that the Church has called us, as Catholics, to do. Pope St. John Paul II taught that with the Second Vatican Council the Church rediscovered her charismatic dimension. The Council clearly states that all the charisms (cf. 1 Cor 12, Eph 4 and Rom 12) "are to be received with thanksgiving and consolation" (Lumen Gentium 12) and that "each of the faithful [have] the right and the duty of exercising them in the Church and in the world...in the freedom of the Holy Spirit..." (AA 3). Priests are exhorted to "discover with faith, recognize with joy, and foster with diligence the many and varied charismatic gifts of the laity, whether these be of a humble or more exalted kind..." (PO 9). Our "marching orders" are

from the Church, including the many pastoral statements of popes, most recently Pope who exhorts Francis Renewal to spread the grace of "baptism of the Spirit" to all. Our age sorely needs this; we must be absolutely convinced of the importance of this for the Church and the world (and for each of us personally), especially for the work of evangelization. (As Fr. Cantalamessa has said, "No new evangelization without a new Pentecost!")

The second thing I sense is that we must not become discouraged. The Lord is in charge! On Palm Sunday of last year, Pope Francis spoke of the joy of those who praised Jesus coming into Jerusalem...yet this joy and praise made some uneasy. "And so the celebration of the people ends up being Hope is demolished, stifled. dreams are killed, joy is suppressed...and charity grows cold." So he asks: "Where is our heart focused? Does Jesus Christ continue to be a source of joy and praise in our hearts?" Joy and hope are two of the





PRAISE AND SONG TRANSFORM US INTO THE IMAGE OF GOD

This is what happens when we are in God's presence, when we listen to his voice, to his Word. The book of Genesis says that "God created man in his image" (Gen 1:27). Not a static image as if it were a painting, but a dynamic one which increases and decreases the likeness to God according to how man exposes himself to God's presence.

Pope Benedict XVI affirms that "faithfulness to prayer gradually transforms us into the divine likeness." Prayer helps us to carry out God's plan for us: become his image, be transfigured, be transformed in Christ. "All of us, gazing with unveiled face on the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, as from the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Cor 3:18).



The protagonist of prayer is the Holy Spirit who comes to help us because "we do not know how to pray as we ought" (Rom 8:26) and guides our prayer. Without the Holy Spirit we can't do anything. Prayer that transforms belongs to those who are docile to the work of the Holy Spirit.


The type of prayer that has characterized the Catholic Renewal since its origins is the prayer of praise. It was, in fact, the first fruit of the Holy Spirit in the early Christian Church: at Pentecost "they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...speaking of the mighty acts of God" (Acts 2:1-13). In the centurion's house, "While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word... for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God" (Acts 10: 44-

Mary, the mother of the Lord, filled with the Holy Spirit sang, "My soul magnifies the Lord." Praise is more of a

consequence of the work of the Holy Spirit rather than the work of the human mind. When we praise God, we are responding to our priestly vocation received at baptism to form a "a spiritual house and a holy priesthood" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 784). The duty of the priest was to "offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God" (1 Pt. 2:5) that is "a sacrifice of praise, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name" (Heb 13:15). Every day in the liturgy the celebrant repeats: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness, but profit us for salvation, through Christ Lord. Amen!" our (Common Preface IV Praise, the gift of God).

In order to be complete, praise needs song which is the

key that opens the secret doors of our heart and allows the Holy Spirit to work in us. This has been my experience. For many years I've been praying with my guitar and my Bible which together with the power of song help me to experience God's healing, forgiveness, prophecy and contemplation. This is the secret of a good worship leader. Singing God's Word is fundamental in our spiritual battle because it makes the devil flee. As St. Ambrose said, "He who sings the Psalms with art takes away the devil's weapon." An inspired song has the power to lift up the congregation "on eagle's wings" and reach the heavens giving a general interior deliverance. "In this way they participate in the purpose of the liturgical words and actions: the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful" (CCC 1157).

"Nothing raises the soul," says St. John Chrysostom, "and frees it from earthly affections and bodily ties, to fill it with love for true wisdom, causing in it a dislike for all things of present life, as a harmonious melody and the rhythm of a Divine canticle."

It is true: Praise and Song help us to become holy, in the image of God.
