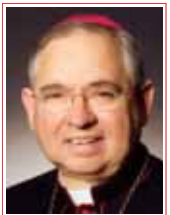

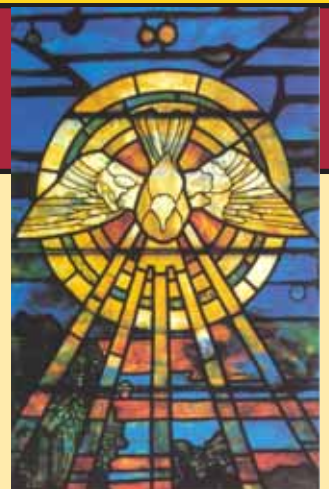

Parent/Adult Chaperone (21 or over)

must be registered and attending the Convention while the Teen Conference is in session.

- Parent/legal guardian must sign the Responsibility/Medical Agreement.

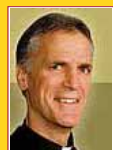

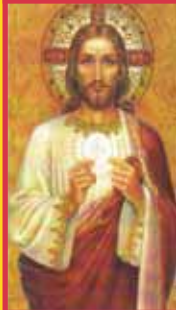

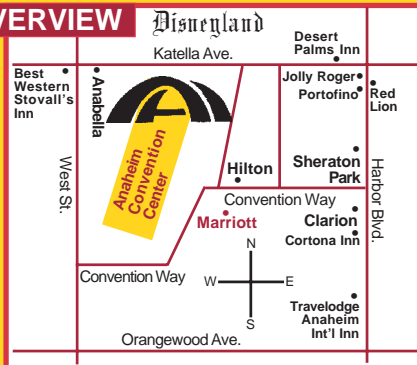
