

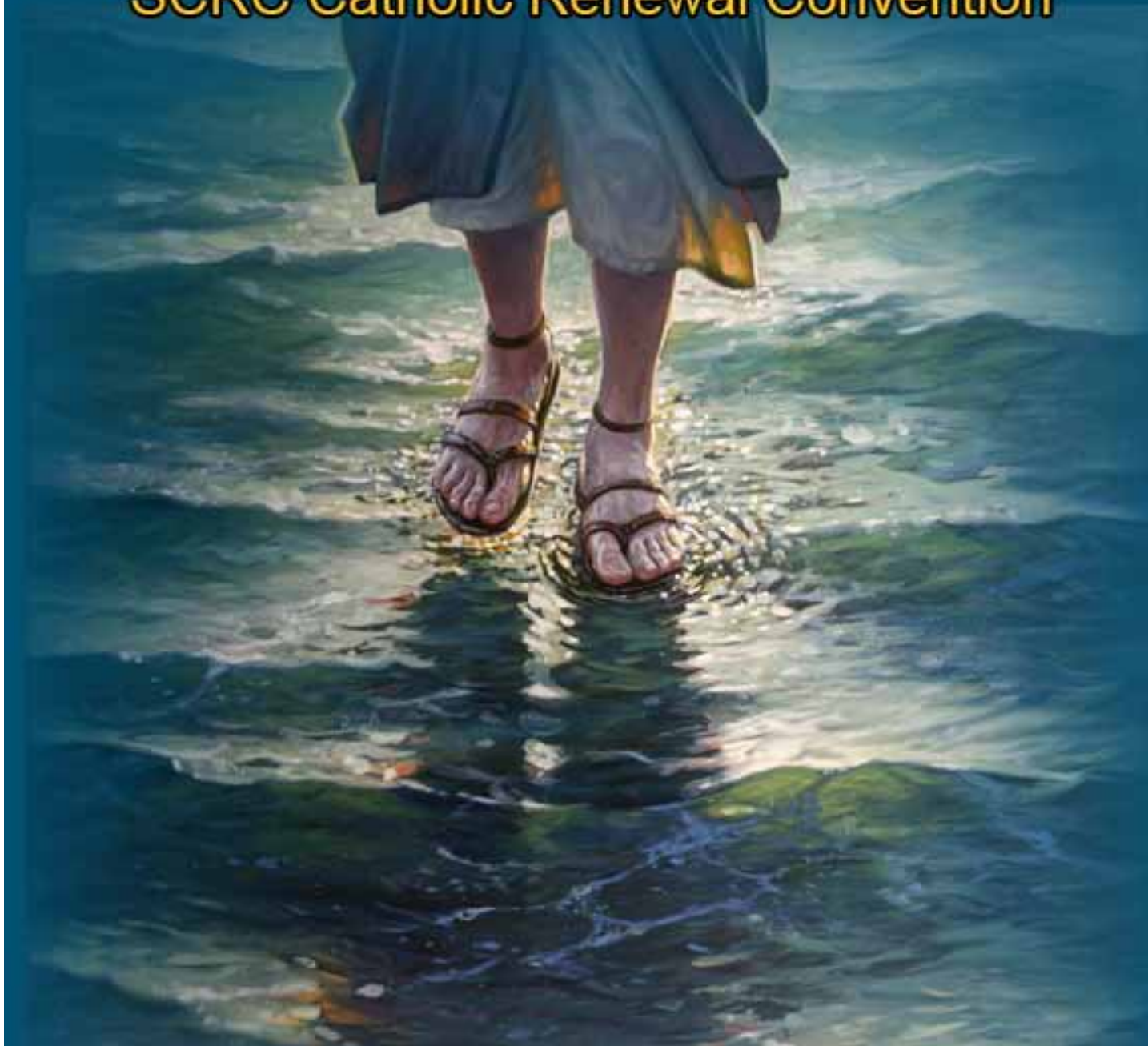

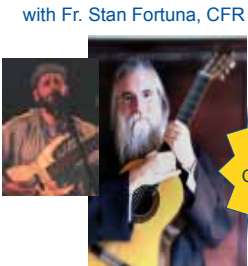

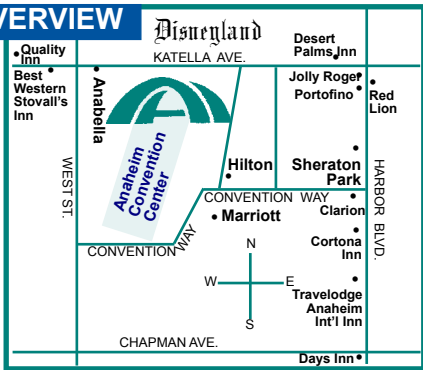

MAP OVERVIEW




